## THE CHALLENGE

- Limited time among senior staff to consider how to integrate new program offerings into the existing evaluation framework;
- Insufficient time and experience among key staff members to build out evaluation resources and tools;
- Lack of project management tools to oversee on-time data collection, reporting, and quality control; and
- Sub-optimal tools for sharing data across teams.

## **OUR SOLUTION**
